How Many Souls Will Be Unprepared When Jesus Comes Again?

There is an old folklore proverb that has been repeated for generations; “Whatever needs to be done needs to be done when it needs to be done.” It is not a quotation from the Holy Scriptures, but it is just another way of saying, “Don’t procrastinate.” This is especially important concerning salvation and spiritual matters.

Let us never be as Felix, waiting “for a convenient time” to consider the gospel and the Christian life and the Judgment to come. (Acts 24:25) Life is too brief and too uncertain to procrastinate obedience to the gospel.

On the day of Pentecost (Acts 2), The apostle Peter preached in Jerusalem that Jesus, who was crucified less than two months earlier, was indeed the Christ whom the prophets had foretold through the centuries. God raised Him from the dead, and Peter said, “We are witnesses.” When the people heard these things “they were cut to the heart,” and asked, “What shall we do?” Peter told them “Repent and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins.” And he exhorted them to be saved. If there were any procrastinators, they are not mentioned, but about 3000 souls were baptized that day.

When Philip preached Jesus to the man from Ethiopia enroute homeward from Jerusalem, and they came to some water, the man said, “See, here is water. What hinders me from being baptized?” Philip told him, “If you believe with all your heart, you may.” The man said, “I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God.” They got out of the chariot and into the water and Philip baptized him. (Acts 8)

The night of the earthquake in Philippi when Paul and Silas were imprisoned there and “spoke the word of the Lord” to the jailer, “immediately he and all his family were baptized.” (Acts 16)

If you’re sitting on a railroad bridge, fishing, and hear a train coming down the rails, it doesn’t take you long to make a decision to move. If you really believe the Lord is coming at a time when He is not expected, then get ready. In the parable of the 10 virgins, they were waiting and fully expecting the coming of the groom, but only the wise made ready. (Matthew 25) In the days of Noah, the masses of the world were not ready for the flood and all but 8 souls perished.

So shall it be at the end of time when the Lord comes. Unbelievers who have rejected the Lord, and those who have chosen the broad and popular way of living, primarily focused on earthly treasures and worldly pleasures; the here and now, with little or no thought of eternity, will face the judgment unprepared. There will be no place to flee from the fire.

God is a God of Love. Christ died to pay the penalty for the sins of all who will come to Him in faith and obedience. The Lord is not willing that any should perish, and therefore has revealed to us, through the Holy Scriptures, what He has done and what we must do to have eternal life. Whether we choose to obey His word or reject it determines our destiny.

Don’t procrastinate. Today is the day of salvation. Watch and be ready. Today may be the only time you have.

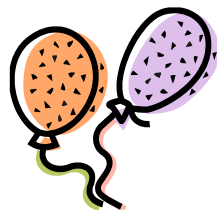

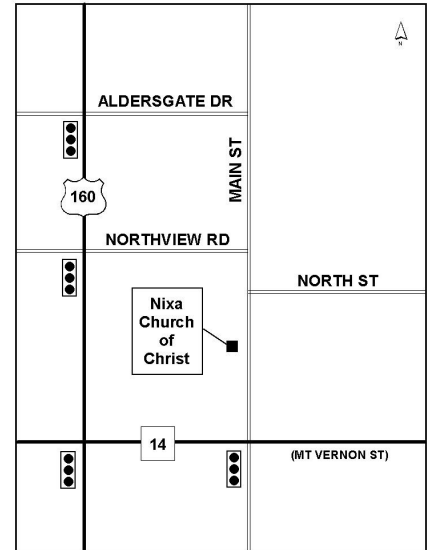
