The Parable of the Truck Drivers

When Loralee and I lived in Ohio, one of the elderly brothers there told a story about hiring truck drivers. I don't know if he originated the story or just liked it enough to tell it often. He repeated it enough that it finally stuck with me, and 25 years later I still remember it. Based on the definition of a parable that I was taught as a child, an earthly story with a heavenly meaning, I would like to present the truck driver parable to you.

There were three truck drivers competing for the same job. In their private individual interviews, they were only asked the following one question. "If you are driving a truck load of goods on the mountainside how close can you get to the edge?" The first driver said, "I can get within two feet of the edge." The second driver, after thinking he probably needed to be closer than the first, said "I could get within one foot of the edge." The third driver said, "I would stay as far from the edge as possible." In this parable the interviewer is God. The truck drivers are Christians, and the edge of the mountain is sin. The result of falling off the edge of the mountain is death. Eternal death is also the result of our life if we spend it in sin. "For the wages of sin is death" (Romans 6:23) "and sin when it is finished, bringeth forth death" (James 1:15).

We need to stay as far away from sin as we can. Jesus emphasizes this point when he states "But I say to you that whoever looks at a woman to lust for her has already committed adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye causes you to sin, pluck it out and cast it from you; for it is more profitable for you that one of your members perish, than for your whole body to be cast into hell. And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and cast it from you; for it is more profitable for you that one of your members perish, than for your whole body to be cast into hell." (Matthew 5:28-30 NKJV)

Jesus is telling us to stay far away from adultery, don't even think about it in your heart. Stay away from lusts of the eye because it can lead to sin. Jesus tells us to cut off our hand if that will keep us from sinning and being cast into hell. His message is clear, stay away from sin! Paul also tells us to stay away from sin. "Flee fornication." (I Corinthians 6:18) "Flee from idolatry." (I Corinthians 10:14) "But those who desire to be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and into many foolish and harmful lusts which drown men in destruction and perdition. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, for which some have strayed from the faith in their greediness, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows. But you, O man of God, flee these things and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, gentleness." (I Timothy 6:9-10)

So, Paul tells us not just to stay away from sin, but to flee, or run away from sin and chase after righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience and gentleness. As we travel down life's highway let's remember the words of Jesus; "strait is the gate, and narrow is the way which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it." (Matthew 7:14). We can't spend our journey deviating towards sin. We need to stay on the narrow path, the way that leads to eternal life in heaven with God. Steer your life far away from sin!




