A Change

There was a time in our life when each of us lived our lives according to our own personal desires, the actions of a physical man. We did whatever thoughts came into our mind. Many of those thoughts and actions were contrary to the teachings and principles of the Bible.

Then a change happened in our life. We heard the teachings of Jesus, and we wanted to be a part of his kingdom. We learned that to be a part of His Kingdom, we had to do the things that are required by the scriptures.

After hearing the word and believing it, we realized that we needed to repent and be baptized to remove our past sins. That took care of the past, but we soon realized that we also needed to make a change in our lifestyle as well. While the change we need to make in our lives may not be as radical as the apostle Paul, we still need to change the focus of our lives from things of the world to things that are truly important in our life.

There was a song that was recorded a few years ago which includes these words:

He made a change in the life that I'm living.

Old things pass away, behold everything's new.

If he can make a change in me he can make a change in you."

(Song, "He Made a Change" by the Cathedrals)

I believe that all of us want to be acceptable to Jesus when the final judgment occurs.

Therefore, we all need to change our lives to conform to the teachings of the scriptures. When we do then God and Jesus will welcome us into that heavenly realm on the day of judgment.


