TICK TOCK TIME IS PRECIOUS

"You do not know what your life will be like tomorrow, you are just a vapor that appears for a little while and then vanishes away." (James 4:14) "Man is like a breath; His days are like a passing shadow." (Psalm 144:4)

The writers of scripture often use metaphors to describe the fleeting nature of human existence. A breath, a shadow, as vapor or a wind, a mist or as a dream, as a flower or grass or a sigh! Proverbs 27:1 advises us not to boast about tomorrow, because we don't know what a day may bring, reminding us of the unpredictability of life and the importance of humility when considering our days here on this earth.

When I was young my dad, a doctor, would take me on house calls at times. One particular visit has remained clear in my mind for over 70 years. This time I could come into the house with him but I would have to sit in the family room and be very quiet while my dad treated the old man in the back bedroom. So, there I sat, No TV, no radio, no nothing! The only entertainment I had was an old clock on the wall that tocked to me. TICK TOCK! TICK TOCK! So loud in that quiet room. All I could think about was how many more tick tocks did that old man have left? Was that one his last? It was quite scary for a guy my age, that I could be experiencing someone's last moment in time.

For all of us....our clock is ticking! What's your clock telling you? That you have plenty of time? How do you know that for sure?

What are we doing with our time? Spending it, wasting it or using it as our Lord created us to do with it? We are advised to "be wise and make the most of our time." (Ephesians 5:16) Moses tells us "So teach us to number our days that we may present to you a heart of wisdom." (Psalms 90:12) Our best way to achieve that is by study and prayer and is not too difficult for any of us. We must take advantage of all opportunities to draw nearer to God and forsake unrighteous ways before it is too late, before our last tick is gone.

Each day of life we have on this earth can be considered a gift from God. But there is an even greater gift than this life God gives us and that is everlasting life with Him in heaven forever. That is only because He gave us the best gift of all His Son, Jesus. Whether we are there with Him or not depends upon how we use our days here on this earth before our time is all gone.

Let's be wise with the time God has blessed us with.


