### He Looked in the Liver

In Ezekiel 21:18, God commands the namesake prophet to build a signpost for the king of Babylon, Nebuchadnezzar. Following the directions on this signpost, Nebuchadnezzar and his armies would be able to bring God's judgement on the disobedient nations of Ammon and Judah.

Later in verse 21, we encounter a very curious phrase about the king himself. "For the king of Babylon stood at the parting of the way, at the head of two ways, to use divination: he made his arrows bright, he consulted with images, **he looked in the liver."** He 'looked in the liver? What does that mean?

The phrase "looking in the liver" actually refers to an ancient method of performing a *divination*, or an attempt to predict the future through supernatural means. In this practice, a qualified priest would remove the liver from an animal such as a sheep or a chicken, and carefully inspect it using a special catalog. They would then use their observations to make a forecast about things to come.

As primitive and silly as it sounds, this is but one of many strange inventions humans have devised for prognostication throughout history. Of course, God condemns all of these practices in no uncertain terms. In Deuteronomy 18:10, we read "There shall not be found among you anyone that maketh his son or his daughter to pass through the fire, **or that useth divination**, or an observer of times, or an enchanter, or a witch. Or a charmer, or a consulter with familiar spirits, or a wizard, or a necromancer. For all that do these things are an abomination unto the LORD: and because of these abominations, the LORD thy God doth drive them out from before thee."

Moses then continues in verse 15: "For the LORD thy God will raise up unto thee a **Prophet** from the midst of thee, of thy brethren, like unto me; **unto him ye shall hearken**." That is to say, instead of relying on all of these strange and wicked methods for guidance in our lives, we should rather listen to the Prophet that God will raise up. We now understand this passage to be a prophecy about Jesus Christ (Acts 3:20-22).

You probably won't find people literally looking in the liver in America today, but how many are doing it figuratively by heeding things like palm-reading, fortune-telling, horoscopes, or even ungodly books and counsel that contradict the teachings of the Bible?

Instead of looking in the liver, we should rather be looking in the Word of God for all matters pertaining to life and religion. As the psalmist wrote, "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path." (Psalm 119:105). The Bible is really a book unlike any other; you can find all manner of practical and spiritual guidance within its pages. Even if your particular situation isn't exactly spelled out in the Scriptures, there are certainly great stories and principles that can help illuminate your path forward.

One of the most prevalent commands in the Bible is to not be anxious about the uncertain future. "Be careful for nothing, but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God." (Philippians 4:6). Let's rely on the Word of God for our direction, rather than appealing to the various 'divinations' of the world.




