Our Perspective On Work

Of all the aspects of your work, which is most critical? What is most important about your employment, whether you punch in at a factory, sit in an office, sweat in a field, or build homes?

For a Christian, the response is this: you labor hard as for the Lord, not for men. Life is certain to include work. When we realize this truth—that we work for Jesus—our perspective of our work changes and helps us to rescue it both from emptiness and idolatry. Genesis 1:28 tells us exactly this. "God blessed them and said to them, "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it." He commanded them to rule over the fish in the sea, the birds in the sky, and every living creature that moves on the ground.

It is Him we want to respect above everything else. Knowing this helps us see that every job has dignity and that we can abound in the Lord's work. "Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain." 1 Cor 15:58

Each morning as we prepare for work and each evening as we relax, knowing we serve the Lord Jesus first can make a difference. Of course, our work can easily frustrate us and demoralize us. On certain days, we can clearly see the thorns, thistles, and cursed earth described in Genesis 3. But 1 Corinthians throws out the assurance to us that when we labor for the Lord, our efforts never go in vain. We never waste any work we do for Him. God weaves all we accomplish for His glory.

Paul tells us, nevertheless, that proof of success in the Lord's work may never be totally evident in this life. Indeed, our perceptions of success can often deceive us! We may see an annual bonus, a promotion, or a sales target hit, but we cannot see the everlasting reward that awaits us when we attain our inheritance or all that God is doing through us. We must live by faith, believing that He is observing our efforts and is applying everything we do to advance His will.

In whatever career you hold right now, make it your first goal to honor Jesus in the way you work. Certainly, try to satisfy your clients and your supervisor, but remember who truly deserves glory from your efforts as each new day starts. Work "by the strength that God provides—in order that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ (1 Peter 4:11). You can find genuine job satisfaction by serving the Lord Christ in your daily endeavors.

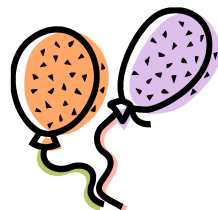

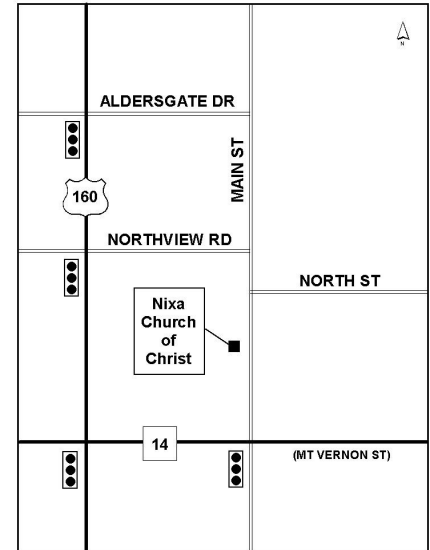
