Your Way or God's Way?

2 Kings chapter 5 tells us the amazing story of Naaman. He was commander of the army of the King of Syria. A great and honorable man in the eyes of his master. A mighty man of valor...but he was a leper. When he learned that a prophet of Israel could heal his leprosy, he made arrangements through his master to go to that prophet to be healed. When Naaman came to the door of the house of Elisha to be healed, Elisha sent his servant to Naaman saying, "go and wash in the Jordan seven times and your flesh shall be restored to you and you shall be clean." To that Naaman became furious and went away saying; "I said to myself, 'he (Elisha) will surely come to me and stand and call on the name of the Lord his God and wave his hands over this place and heal the leprosy.' Aren't the rivers of Damascus better than all the water of Israel?"...and he went away in a rage. Soon Naaman's servant came to him and asked, "if the prophet had told you to do something great, would you not have done it?" And so, he did.

Here we have Naaman; a handsome, powerful, wealthy and proud man, who had his own ideas about how things should go and almost missed his opportunity to be healed. The first thing Naaman needed to do was get his pride in check. Proverbs 19:21 tells us "there are many plans in a man's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails." 1 Peter 5:5-6 references another Proverb, "for 'God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble.' Therefore, humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He might exalt you in due time." If we think God should be more obvious in how he interacts with man remember how Paul put it in 1 Corinthians 1:27-29, "But God has chosen the foolish things of the world to put to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to put to shame the things which are mighty; and the base things of this world and the things despised God has chosen, and the things which are not, to bring to nothing the things that are, that no flesh should glory in His presence."

Naaman's story reminds us that "there is a way which seems right unto a man, but the end thereof leads unto death." (Proverbs14:12). Far too many people hear or read what God requires of them but have 'better' ideas about how to go about obeying Him. Let's be careful thinking our ways are better than the instructions we get from our Lord. "For My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways My ways," says the Lord. (Isaiah 55:8)


